Spencer**



Mr. Kevin Spencer is an internationally recognised Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeon and the first surgeon trained in Australia and New Zealand to complete a medical degree before undertaking dental and specialist surgical training in the field. Graduating in Medicine from the University of Auckland with First Class Honours, Dr Spencer went on to earn his dental degree at the University of Melbourne, where he graduated first in his class and received multiple academic awards. He completed his Master of Dental Science and specialist fellowship (FRACDS OMS), achieving the medal for the Top Candidate in the national fellowship examinations.

With extensive training across leading hospitals in Australia, New Zealand, and the United States; including a fellowship at the University of Minnesota. Mr. Spencer has held senior clinical and academic appointments, including Clinical Assistant Professor at Hennepin County Medical Center in Minneapolis and Consultant Surgeon at the Royal Melbourne Hospital. He is currently in specialist private practice in Melbourne (OMFS) and he serves as an examiner for the RACDS for the Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery candidates.

Mr Spencer has published widely in peer-reviewed journals on topics ranging from reconstructive jaw surgery to oral cancer management. He is a Fellow of the Royal Australasian College of Dental Surgeons and an active member of multiple professional associations.

Dr Theresia Sudjalim a specialist orthodontist with particular interest in paediatric and surgical orthodontics. She is the principal orthodontist at Berwick Orthodontics, Hawthorn Orthodontics and South Yarra Orthodontics. She holds a Doctor of Clinical Dentistry (Orthodontics) from the University of Melbourne. She is a fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh, where she was awarded the Dean's Medal and she is a Fellow of the Royal Australasian College of Dental Surgeons, where she was awarded the Kenneth J.G. Sutherland Prize.

Dr Sudjalim has taught orthodontics at the University of Melbourne across both dental and oral health programs. She is a spokesperson for the Australian Society of Orthodontists and is a committee member for the ASO Communications and Information Committee. She is an Invisalign Faculty Member and international lecturer.

Dr Sudjalim is on the Board of the Australian Centre of Contemporary Art and an Australian Ambassador for the Venice Biennale. She is also a committee member of the Scotch College Parents Association.

The art of rubber dam (for Dentist's & Dental Assistants)

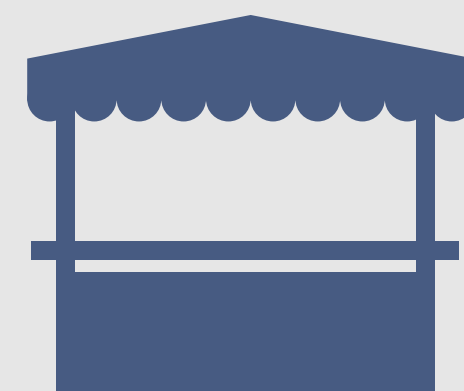
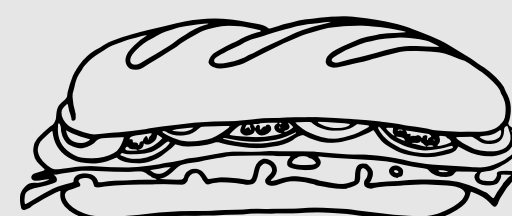
