Urgent dental treatment for confirmed or probable COVID-19 cases

Adapted from Dental Health Services Victoria COVID-19 Level 2 Pathways Procedure, 10 July 2020

COVID-19 outbreaks in Metropolitan Melbourne and the Mitchell Shire increase the likelihood of dental emergencies in patients that are either confirmed or probable cases. These patients should not be seen for routine care or provided with emergency care in private dental practices or community health clinics. Where possible, try to manage these patients pharmacologically. If emergency treatment is required, then they should be referred to an acute hospital for management.
